Congregational Home to Mark 20th Anniversary at Special Service


On Sunday, June 19, Congregational Home will celebrate its 20th anniversary and express appreciation of support provided by First Congregational Church with a special service and reception at the church.

It was through the congregation's gifts in the early 1970's that Congregational Home was able to begin construction of this facility in Brookfield. These gifts, when added to the gift of land purchased for the Home by the Church, brought the total contributions to the Home, at its beginning in June, 1974, to more than \$1,000,000.

In the ensuing 20 years, many, many gifts in time and talent by volunteers, together with financial aid provided by hundreds of donors, have helped make Congregational Home and the more-recently constructed Congregational Apartments a special place for the 130 residents.

On Sunday, June 19, this very successful Christian endeavor will be celebrated with the membership in the church's worship service. Preaching will be by the Home's chaplain, the Rev. Robert L. Woodbury. Assisting him will be Fred Rennebohm. Following the service, a special celebration of appreciation will be hosted by members of the Home's Board of Directors and staff.

Underwriting the construction and providing the continuing direction of a full-facility retirement home by one church is a rare accomplishment. It is a beautiful testimony



Interim Senior Minister Has Family Ties to Church

The Reverend Robert S. Wilch was called as Interim Senior Minister by a unanimous vote of those members present at the congregational meeting on May 5, 1994. He assumed his duties immediately, preaching his first sermon to an enthusiastic crowd on May 8.

In December of 1987, Rev. Wilch happily chose early retirement from his duties as a Bishop of the Wisconsin Upper Michigan Synod. At the time, the church was reorganizing due to the merger which created the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA). However, after guest preaching in the summer of 1993, All Saints Church in Wales requested that he serve as interim minister and Rev. Wilch accepted.

Thortly before his term in Wales was nished, members of the Search Committee approached Rev. Wilch with an offer to serve as Interim

Rev. Wilch said that after considering theological concerns, he was enchanted with the opportunity and his wife Sandy - a past member- was also happy with the opportunity to become reinvolved.

Rev. Wilch and his wife, Sandy, each have three children. Two of the six, Stephen and Diane, are members at First Congregational Church while the remaining four live in Chicago. Rev. and Sandy Wilch live in Hartland.

Rev. Wilch said that in preparing for the new Scnior Minister, he will focus on making the worship services attractive, working with membership development, and assisting with stewardship in Autumn. At this point, however, Rev. Wilch said he needs to examine all areas of the church and see what needs strengthening.

Rev. Wilch also added that he is enjoying working with the staff and appreciates the very cordial welcome he and his wife have received.
