



2019 began with some challenges at First Church, but we have overcome those and moved forward with many wonderful activities, programs and initiatives during the year.

We reorganized the staff with Jill Bruss moving to a new role as Financial Secretary, Marianne King joining as Office Coordinator and Mark Lund taking on additional responsibilities as Lead Custodian. My thanks to Cindy Walsh for her help in guiding the office through this transition.



Our focus this year was to implement and expand upon many of the wonderful ideas that came out of the Long Range Planning Retreats held in 2018.

The Communications Committee has implemented a robust marketing campaign with the theme *Under the Steeple*. They have installed new banners, used targeted direct mail and advertising. They have implemented an active social media program using Facebook and the Next Door and Patch platforms. They have just updated and put into place a wonderful new website that fully operates with desktops, cell phones and tablets.

Under the leadership of Pat Reddy, Peggy Griffith and Maddie Sgarlata, we now offer a worship service called *Saturday Under the Steeple*. This additional worship opportunity for the community is a casual, informal service held in the Chapel on Saturdays at 4:00 p.m..

Tonia Wallner, the CE Board and Jim Santelle have worked with their counterparts at St. Mark AME Church to engage the youth of each church and to work together on a community service project.

Thank you to all of our members and friends who stepped forward to commit to the Capital Campaign to replace the Elevator and renovate the Chancel. Thank you to all who responded to the recent Stewardship Campaign. Through your generosity we are able to balance the budget, support our staff and programs, reach out to those in need and maintain our beautiful building.

Thanks to past Moderator Marianne King and incoming Moderator Hank Collis. All mainstream churches face the challenge of declining membership and increasing demands on the time of members and our children. First Church faces those challenges. However, under the spiritual guidance of Bill and Barry and the efforts of each of our dedicated members, I am confident that First Church will continue to move forward to serve the Lord.

The year ahead will be one thoroughly saturated in political rhetoric as we approach another major election in this nation. Throughout my career I have done my best to keep politics out of the pulpit. And yet, each time I step into that voting booth I wonder, how does my faith feed my political decision-making?

The First Amendment of the United States Constitution reads, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment

of religion nor prohibit the free exercise thereof." What the First Amendment is saying is that government should stay out of religion, but religious people can exercise their faith in the influence of public policy.

Over the past fifty years, society has misinterpreted the Constitution. We've majored in the first part of the amendment while abandoning the second part, and in doing so, we have disenfranchised the gospel – politically, socially,



A Note From Pastor Barry

We are adept at putting up barriers when we don't want to communicate with others or are required to do something we feel to be unpleasant. We set up obstacles to anything we have to do which we don't perceive to be fun. It doesn't make any difference whether the task is at work or at home. So we, like Dilbert, are creative in sidestepping what we need to do. Even in communication at home, family members erect barriers to avoid serious conversations. Therefore we have to ask ourselves whether, in the spiritual world, we place impediments to God. Perhaps one excuse we make is that we don't have time. When we look at Jesus at his baptism, we see that Jesus accepted his role of what God the Father wanted of him. Then he spent forty days in the desert for his final preparation before his public ministry. After he chose his apostles, he preached, taught, healed, and then undertook his cross. Jesus did not seek out excuses to impede what his Father asked of him. What about us? Most of us have an idea of what gifts we have been given by birth, family, education, and culture - and we have an idea of



how better we can love those around us - and what good we can accomplish. On the other hand, how does our anger push others away from us and from God? How does our coveting our neighbors' goods, stuff, cars, and homes push us away from God? We know that pride and greed and anger cause people to become more and more selfish and insular. Therefore, whether we set up barriers such as a lack of time, or just let our lack of virtue control us, creating excuses and obstacles so we don't have to have a serious conversation with God in prayer can tell us a lot about ourselves.

What's Going On With The Organ?

In 1966, First Church installed the Möller organ, with a total 2300 pipes in 41 ranks. As with any instrument of this magnitude and complexity, there are multiple components that must work together to ensure the instrument functions optimally.



In December, the electrical system of the organ was compromised during a power surge in the church. Problems with the electrical components made the organ unusable for a time. David Beyer and John Meyer from Riedel and Associates, our organ service provider, have been working to assess the situation and resolve the issues caused by the power surge. At the time this was written, they had restored some function to the instrument and, on Sunday, Jan. 5th, I was once again able to play the organ for our 10 am service.

We are blessed at First Church to have this beautiful instrument as part of our worship. I will continue to share updates on the situation as they are available.


