ADORATION

Florence Beatrice Price (née Smith) an African-American classical composer, pianist, organist and music teacher, born in Little Rock, Arkansas, on April 9, 1887, was educated at the New England Conservatory of Music. From 1927 until her death in 1953, she was active in Chicago where she began a friendship with writer Langston Hughes and contralto Marian Anderson, both prominent figures in the art world who aided in Price's future success as a composer. Price is noted as the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and the first to have a composition played by a major orchestra.
